### FEMA Registration:

Transitional Shelter Assistance (TSA) is activated. Households should check with FEMA for eligibility for hotel assistance. The [disasterassistance.gov](http://disasterassistance.gov) website has the list for participating hotels when they know they are eligible.

Critical Needs Assistance (CNA) has been turned on under the individual assistance program/other needs assistance for the Texas disaster and can provide \$500/family for emergency needs related to the disaster. Households should also inquire about this benefit. It could provide them with funds to assist with their immediate needs. CAN Fact Sheet:
